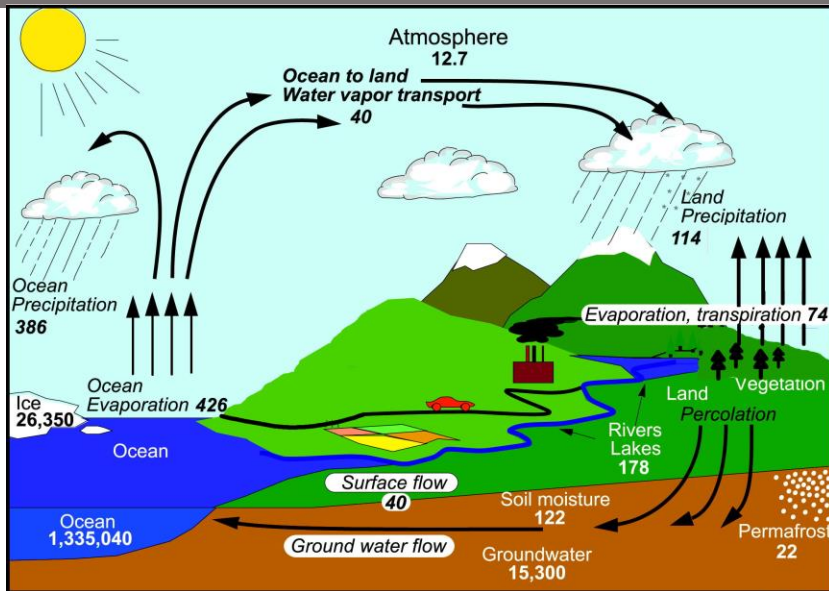
We have had a wonderful first week of the Summer Term in year 3 and have hit the ground running with our new topics that we will be exploring!

We have also explored songs from musicals in our reading sessions. It has been wonderful to see the children engage with these songs and share their very thoughtful views on the lyrics.

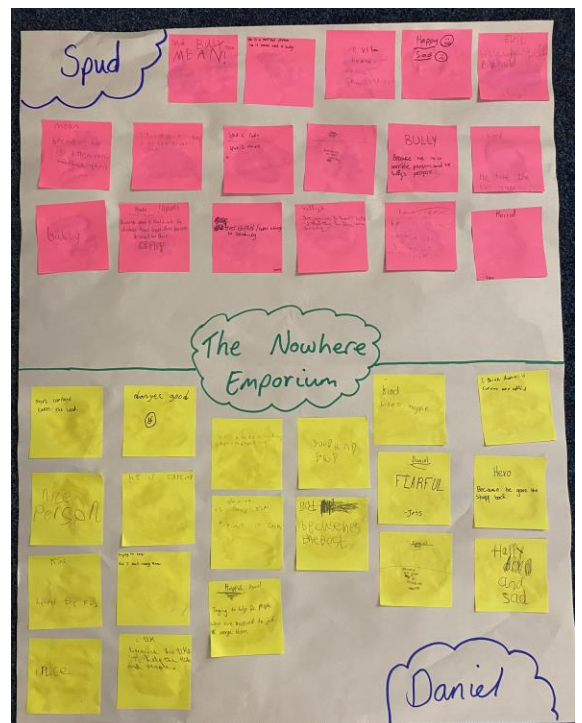
